King Rama Kamhaeng was a Thai here

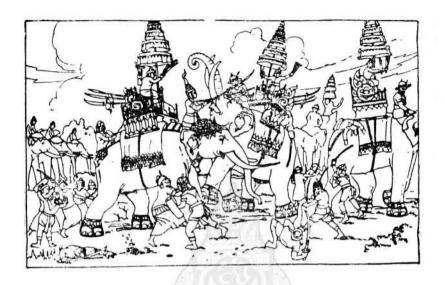

and the toddy-palm.





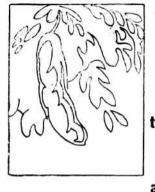
They are all very tall trees.

We also use palm leaves sometimes for the roofs of our houses. These are attap palms.

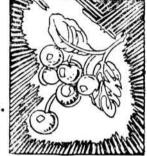

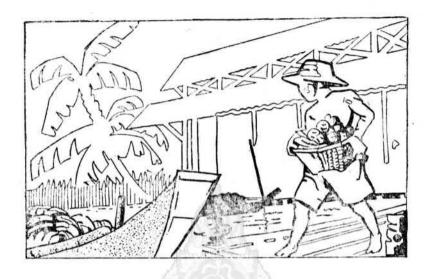

There are so many kinds of fruit-trees that we cannot speak of them all.

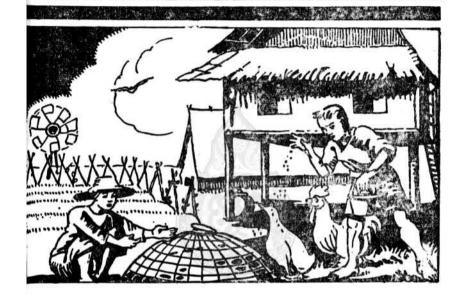


When the different fruits are ripe,

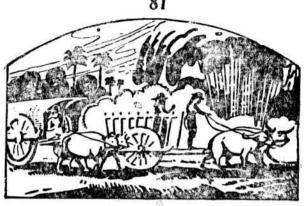

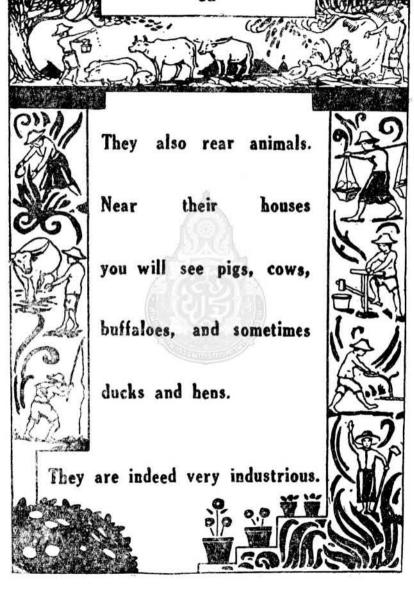

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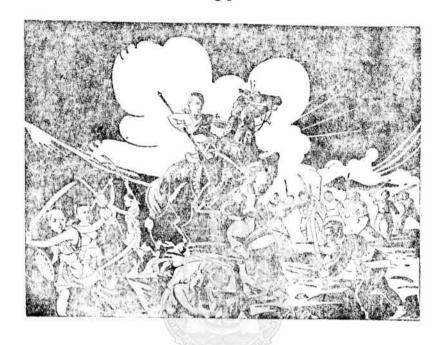
THE TORY OF MO
