คำนำ

อนุสนธิจากการเปลี่ยนแผนการศึกษาแห่งชาติ และเปลี่ยนหลักสูตรมัธยมศึกษา
พ.ศ. ๒๕๐๓ กรมวิสามัญศึกษาได้พิจารณาเห็นว่าแบบเรียนภาษาอังกฤษที่ใช้อยู่
ในโรงเรียนมัธยมศึกษา ยังชาดความเหมาะสมสำหรับนักเรียนไทย จึงได้มอบให้หน่วย
ศึกษานิเทศก์กรมวิสามัญศึกษา จัดทำหนังสือชุด English for Thai Students ขึ้น
โดยมีคณะกรรมการโครงการภาษาอังกฤษภาคเอเชียอาคเนย์ (South East Asian Regional English Project) เรียกชื่อย่อว่า คณะกรรมการ SEAREP ซึ่งมี Mr. Bryce Van Syoc เป็นผู้อำนวยการโครงการ ให้ความรวมมืออย่างใกล้ชิด งานจัดทำหนังสือชุดนี้ได้เริ่มมาคั้งแต่ปี ๒๕๐๓ โดยคณะกรรมการ SEAREP ได้ยกร่างหนังสือชื้นแล้ว ให้ศึกษานิเทศก์ผ่ายภาษาอังกฤษช่วยพิจารณาเนื้อหาให้สอดคล้องกับ หลักสูตรวิชาภาษาอังกฤษสำหรับชั้นมัธยมศึกษาตอนตัน หนังสือชุดนี้ได้จัดทำปีละ ๑ เล่ม จนครบ ๓ เล่มในปี ๒๕๐๖

เพื่อให้หนังสือชุดนี้มีลักษณะเหมาะสมที่จะใช้สำหรับโรงเรียนมัธยมในประเทศไทย อย่างแท้จริง ได้มีการทดลองสอนบทเรียนแต่ละบทที่จัดทำชื้น ณ โรงเรียนสตรีศรีสุริโยทัย เพื่อพิจารณาแก้ไขบัญหาที่อาจมีขึ้นได้ ทั้งในด้านการเรียนของนักเรียนและการสอนของ ครู เมื่อได้ทำหนังสือเล่มแรกสำเร็จแล้ว กรมวิสามัญศึกษาก็ได้อนุมัติให้คณะผู้จัดทำ เริ่มโครงการทดลองใช้หนังสือชุดนี้ ในโรงเรียนทั้งส่วนกลางและส่วนภูมิภาค มีโรงเรียน ในโครงการทดลองและปรับปรุงของกรมวิสามัญศึกษา ๔ โรงเรียน และโรงเรียน ประเคราะห์ของโครงการพัฒนาการศึกษา ๒ โรงเรียน ระยะเวลาสำหรับทดลองใช้ หนังสือชุดนี้มีกำหนด ๓ ปี คือตั้งแต่ปีการศึกษา ๒๕๐๔ ถึงปีการศึกษา ๒๕๐๖ และ ทดลองใช้ในขั้นมัธยมศึกษาปีที่ ๑ ถึงมัธยมศึกษาปีที่ ๓ ตามลำดับ ในการทดลองนี้ คณะกรรมการ SEAREP ก็ได้ปฏิบัติงานร่วมกับศึกษานิเทศก์ผ่ายภาษาอังกฤษอยู่ตลอด เวลา ได้มีการนิเทศและอบรมครูที่ทำการสอนโดยใช้หนังสือชุดนี้ และมีการประชุม ล้มมนาผู้แทนครูภาษาอังกฤษ

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การทดลองของแต่ละปี ในต้นปีการศึกษา ๒๕๐๖ ศึกษานิเทศก์ฝ่ายภาษาอังกฤษ ร่วมกับฝู่แทนคณะกรรมการ SEAREP และผู้แทนครูภาษาอังกฤษ จากโรงเรียน ในโครงการทดลองและปรับปรุงของกรมวิสามัญศึกษา ได้นำผลของการทดลองที่ รวบรวมได้ มาทำการปรับปรุงแก้ไขหนังสือขุดนี้จนสำเร็จ และได้เสนอให้กรมวิชาการ จัดพิมพ์เพื่อใช้ในโรงเรียนทั่วไป

กรมวิสามัญศึกษาหวังว่า แบบเรียนซุดนี้ ซึ่งคณะผู้จัดทำได้ทำด้วยความอุตสาหะ เป็นเวลาแรมปี คงจะเป็นแบบเรียนที่เหมาะสมกับนักเรียนไทย และคงจะช่วยปรับปรุง มาตรฐานการเรียนภาษาอังกฤษในระดับชั้นมัธยมศึกษาตอนต้นให้ดียิ่งขึ้น กรม วิสามัญศึกษาขอแสดงความขอบคุณคณะกรรมการ SEAREP และศึกษานิเทศก์ผ่าย ภาษาอังกฤษ ตลอดจนคณะครูของโรงเรียนต่าง ๆ ที่ได้มีส่วนร่วมในการจัดทำหนังสือ ชุดนี้ไว้ ณ ที่นี้ด้วยเป็นอันมาก หวังว่าหนังสือชุดนี้คงจะอำนวยประโยชน์แก่การศึกษา เป็นส่วนรวม สมตามเจตนารมณ์ของคณะผู้จัดทำ และสมตามความมุ่งหมายของ หลักสูตรมัธยมศึกษา.

คำสี้แจงในการจัดทำหนังสือ

บทเรียน ๓๐ บท ซึ่งได้รวมพิมพ์เป็นเล่มหนังสือนี้ เป็นบทเรียนของหนังสือเล่มแรก ในขุดหนังสือแบบเรียนภาษาอังกฤษ ที่จัดทำสำหรับขั้นมัธยมศึกษาตอนต้น หรืออีกนัยหนึ่ง สำหรับนักเรียนที่เรียนภาษาอังกฤษมาแล้วอย่างน้อย ๓ ปี ส่วนหนังสือเล่มอื่น ๆ ในขุด ดังกล่าว ก็จะได้พิมพ์ออกโดยสำดับ

บทเรียนในหนังสือเล่มนี้เน้นในเรื่องการสอนพูดอังกฤษ และให้ความสำคัญเช่นเดียว กับการสอนอ่านและเขียน ผู้เขียนได้พยายามจัดทำบทเรียนเพื่อให้เป็นประโยชน์แก่นักเรียน ในการที่จะสามารถใช้ภาษาได้อย่างแท้จริงโดยเฉพาะในการพูด ยิ่งกว่าที่จะให้รู้ภาษา แต่ในลักษณะตัวหนังสือ แต่ไม่สามารถพูดหรือใช้ประโยชน์ได้ ด้วยเหตุนี้ในการสอน จึงถือว่าเป็นเรื่องสำคัญอย่างยิ่งที่ครูจะต้องนำแบบฝึกต่าง ๆ ที่มีอยู่ในบทเรียนมาฝึกให้ นักเรียนพูด จนกว่านักเรียนจะสามารถออกเสียง เข้าใจและใช้ได้ ครูจึงจะฝึกให้นักเรียน อ่านและเขียนต่อไป

ในการจัดทำบทเรียนแต่ละบทนั้น ได้อาศัยผลการวิจัยเปรียบเทียบภาษาทั้ง ๒ ภาษา คือ ภาษาอังกฤษและภาษาไทย ว่าสิ่งใดบ้างจะเป็นปัญหาสำหรับนักเรียนไทยในการเรียน ภาษาอังกฤษ และได้นำเอาสิ่งที่เป็นปัญหานั้นมาเป็นเนื้อหาในการสร้างแบบผึกหัดเพื่อให้ นักเรียนได้ฝึกจนเกิดความสามารถและความชำนาญในการที่จะนำสิ่งที่ได้รับการฝึกนั้น ไปใช้ นอกจากนั้นยังพยายามเรียงลำดับบทเรียนจากง่ายไปหายาก จากสิ่งที่นักเรียน เคยทราบไปหาสิ่งที่ยังไม่ทราบ และได้พยายามวางหลักการจัดทำไว้ว่า เนื้อหาภาษา อังกฤษที่จะบรรจุลงในบทเรียนหนึ่ง ๆ นั้นจะมีสิ่งที่เป็นปัญหาแก่นักเรียนไม่ว่าในแง่การ ออกเสียงหรือในแง่ไวยากรณ์ไม่เกิน ๒ อย่าง อนึ่งบทเรียน ๑๐ บทแรกในหนังสือเล่มนี้นั้น ได้เครียมไว้สำหรับเป็น บทเรียน เพื่อช่อม แต่งความรู้เบื้องต้นของนักเรียน ที่นักเรียนได้ เรียนมาแล้วในปีต้น ๆ ของการเรียนภาษาอังกฤษ ที่ทำไว้เช่นนี้ก็เพราะข้อเท็จจริงมีอยู่ว่า นักเรียนมักจะบกพร่องในความรู้ภาษาอังกฤษเบื้องต้นที่สำคัญ ๆ อันเน็นเหตุให้การเรียน ภาษาอังกฤษเบื้องต้นที่สำคัญ ๆ อันเน็นเหตุให้การเรียน ภาษาอังกฤษเบื้องต้นที่สำคัญ ๆ อันเน็นเหตุให้การเรียน ภาษาอังกฤษเบื้องต้นที่สำคัญ ๆ อันเน็นเหตุให้การเรียน ภาษาอังกฤษเบื้องต้นที่สำคัญ ๆ อันเน็นเหตุให้การเรียน

ในที่สด หวังว่าบทเรียนต่าง ๆ ในหนังสือเล่มนี้จะเป็นประโยชน์แก่ครูที่สอนภาษา อังกฤษในระดับชั้นดังกล่าว ไม่ว่าครูผู้นั้นจะได้ศึกษาวิธีสอนภาษาอังกฤษจากสถาบันการ ศึกษาของอเมริกัน อังกฤษ หรือชาติใดก็ตามที่ใช้ภาษาอังกฤษ เพราะดังได้กล่าวมาแล้ว ข้างต้น บทเรียนทุกบทได้จัดทำเพื่อนักเรียนไทยโดยเฉพาะ โดยพิจารณาหาทางขจัดปัญหา ค่าง ๆ ที่จะเป็นอุปสรรคต่อการเรียนภาษาอังกฤษของนักเรียนให้หมดไป ผู้เขียนหนังสือ เลมนี้คือ Mr. Lionel Thompson เป็นขาวอังกฤษ สำเร็จการศึกษาจากมหาวิทยาลัย ออกซ ฟอร์ดในประเทศอังกฤษ และมหาวิทยาลัยมิชิแกน ในประเทศสหรัฐอเมริกา เคยทำการสอนภาษาอังกฤษแก่คนต่างชาติ ในประเทศออสเตรเลีย และต่อมาก็ได้ทำการ ชอนในประเทศลาวและประเทศไทยเป็นลำดับ Mr. Lionel Thompson วิชาภาษาศาสตร์ และเป็นผู้ชำนาญในการสอน จึงทราบถึงปัญหาอันเนื่องมาแต่ความ แตกต่างบางอย่างของภาษาอังกฤษแบบต่าง ๆ ที่ปรากฏอยู่ในปัจจุบันเป็นอย่างดี ข้อ แตกต่างดังกล่าวนี้มีเป็นส่วนน้อยมากในภาษา จึงมิใช่เป็นเรื่องลำคัญที่ควรนำมาพิจารณา โดยเฉพาะในการที่จะเลือกใช้หนังสือแบบเรียนที่ผู้เขียนได้พยายามจัดทำอย่างประณีต ละเอียดลดก.

แนะนำวิธีใช้หนังสือ

ความมุ่งหมายในการจัดทำบทเรียนเหล่านี้ ก็เพื่อจะช่วยให้นักเรียนสามารถพูดภาษา อังกฤษได้ดี รวมทั้งให้สามารถในการอ่านและเซียนด้วย

ในการนึกแบบนึกหัดต่าง ๆ เกี่ยวกับการออกเสียง ศัพท์ ไวยากรณ์ การอ่าน และการเซียนซึ่งได้จัดทำไว้ในหนังสือนี้นั้น ได้แสดงวิธีการไว้เป็นแนวในการนึก ซึ่งจะ ช่วยให้ครูผู้สอนสามารถเข้าใจได้โดยไม่ต้องได้รับการนึกอบรมเป็นพิเศษในเรื่องวิธีสอนแต่ อย่างใด สำหรับกำหนดเวลาที่จะใช้ในการนึกบทเรียนแต่ละบทในหนังสือนี้ย่อมขึ้นกับความ สามารถและพื้นความรู้ของนักเรียนเป็นสำคัญ กล่าวโดยทั่วไปแล้ว ควรใช้เวลาคิดเฉลี่ย แล้วประมาณ ๔ ชั่วโมงต่อหนึ่งบทเรียน และในการสอนนั้น ควรมุ่งที่จะให้นักเรียนได้นึก จริง ๆ และนึกด้วยความเข้าใจ จึงจะช่วยให้นักเรียนเรียนรู้ภาษาอังกฤษสมดังความ มุ่งหมายที่ระบุไว้ในหลักสูตร

ต่อไปนี้จะได้กล่าวถึงวิธีสอน และกลวิธีผึก ซึ่งควรนำมาใช้ในการผึก และสอน เนื้อหาต่าง ๆ ในหนังสือนี้ตามลำดับดังนี้

การฝึกออกเสียง

ก่อนที่จะกล่าวถึงกลวิธีฝึกการออกเสียงนั้น ครูจำเป็นจะค้องทราบก่อนว่า คำซึ่ง
ปรากฏในแบบฝึกออกเสียงเป็นคำซึ่งเหมาะสำหรับใช้ในการฝึกออกเสียงเท่านั้น ครูไม่
จำเป็นต้องบอกความหมายหรือสอนคำเหล่านั้นแก่นักเรียนเหมือนสอนคำศัพท์ แต่ควร
เพ่งเล็งฝึกในเรื่องเสียงดังที่เตรียมไว้ในตอนฝึกออกเสียง (pronunciation) แต่ละตอน
ในบทเรียนหนึ่ง ๆ โดยมุ่งฝึกให้นักเรียนสามารถพังและออกเสียงต่าง ๆ เหล่านั้นให้ถูกต้อง

กลวิธีผึ้กการออกเลี้ยง

กลวิธีผึกการออกเสียงที่จะกล่าวต่อไปนี้มี ๔ วิธี คือ กลวิธีผึกการออกเสียง แบบ A แบบ B แบบ C และแบบ D กลวิธีผึก ๒ แบบแรกเป็นการฝึกให้นักเรียน ได้ยิน เสียงที่ต้องการฝึก คือสามารถบอกได้ว่าเสียงที่ได้ยินเป็นเสียงใด และ สามารถได้ยินความแตกต่างเมื่อได้พังเสียงนั้นเปรียบเทียบกับเสียงอื่น ส่วนกลวิธีผึก การออกเสียงแบบ C และแบบ D เป็นการฝึกให้นักเรียนสามารถออกเสียงที่ต้องการ ผึกให้ถูกต้อง วิธีการของแต่ละแบบมีดังนี้

วิธีฝึก ครูควรออกเสียงคำจากคอลัมน์ทั้ง ๒ ให้นักเรียนได้พังเป็นตัวอย่างเสียก่อน แล้วจึงเริ่มดำเนินการยึกดังนี้

- ก. การออกเสียงคำที่เป็นคู่กันจากคอลัมน์ (๑) และ (๒) เช่น tinthin แล้วให้นักเรียนบอกว่าคำสองคำนั้น มีเสียงเหมือนก์นหรือต่างกัน
- ข. ครูออกเสียงคำที่เสียงเหมือนกัน เช่น tick......thick แล้วให้นักเรียน บอกว่าคำสองคำนั้นมีเสียงเหมือนกันหรือต่างกัน

ครูควรดำเนินการฝึกดังกล่าวข้างต้น โดยให้นักเรียนได้พังเลี้ยงคู่ที่เหมือนกัน และต่างกันสลับกันไป และเมื่อนักเรียนทั้งชั้นสามารถทำกลวิธีฝึกแบบ A ได้คล่อง ครูควรเริ่มใช้กลวิธีฝึกแบบ B ต่อไป

กลวิธีผึ้กการออกเลี้ยง แบบ B

วิธีนี้ก ครูออกเสียงคำที่ละคำ ให้นักเรียนบอกว่าคำนั้นเป็นคำจากคอลัมน์ (1) หรือ (2)

ตัวอย่าง ครู : thank

นักเรียน : 2

ครู : taught

กลวิธีนี้กการออกเลี้ยง แบบ C

กลวิธีนึกแบบนี้ ดังได้กล่าวแล้วช้างต้น มุ่งนึกให้นักเรียนออกเสียงที่ต้องการนึก ได้ถูกต้อง ซึ่งผิดกับกลวิธีนึก แบบ A และแบบ B ซึ่งมุ่งนึกความสามารถในการพัง เลียงของนักเรียน

วิธีนี้ก (ดูตัวอย่างบทนึกข้างต้น)

ครูออกเสียงคำเป็นตัวอย่าง นักเรียนทั้งขั้นออกเสียงตาม ครูอาจออกเสียงคำ จากที่ละคอลัมน์ เริ่มด้วยคอลัมน์ (1) แล้วจึงไปคอลัมน์ (2) หรือครูอาจจับคู่คำจาก คอลัมน์ทั้งสอง แล้วให้นักเรียนพูดตาม จากนั้นก็ให้นักเรียนออกเสียงเองโดยไม่ต้องว่า ตามครู ถ้าสามารถทำได้ ควรให้นักเรียนได้ออกเสียงเป็นรายตัว เพื่อดูว่านักเรียน สามารถออกเสียงได้จริงและถูกต้องเพียงใด

กลวิธีนี้กการออกเสียง แบบ D

ครูอาจใช้วิธีนึกแบบนี้เป็นขั้นสุดท้าย เป็นการสอนและทดสอบไปในตัว เพื่อดูว่า นักเรียนสามารถพังเสียงได้ถูกต้องและในขณะเดียวกันก็สามารถออกเสียงที่ต้องการนึก ได้ถูกหรือไม่ วิธีนึกนี้กล่าวได้ว่าเป็นการนำวิธีนึกทั้ง ๓ แบบข้างต้นมานึกรวมกัน

วิถียึก

ครูออกเลี้ยงคำจากคอลัมน์ใดคอลัมน์หนึ่ง ให้นักเรียนออกเลี้ยงคำนั้นซ้ำ ก่อนที่ นักเรียนจะให้คำที่อยู่คู่กันในอีกคอลัมน์หนึ่งของบทน์

ตัวอย่าง ครู : tick

นักเรียน : tick — thick

ครู : thank

นักเรียน : thank — tani.

ข้อสังเกตในการผึกการออกเสียง

๑. การใช้เวลาสำหรับการ ยึกออกเสียงในระยะต้นนี้ ควรใช้เวลาประมาณ ๑๐% — ๑๕% ของเวลาที่ใช้ในการสอนบทเรียนแต่ละบท (คิดเฉลี่ยประมาณ บทเรียนละ ๔ ชั่วโมง) ทั้งนี้ขึ้นกับปริมาณ ความยากงายของเนื้อหา และความสามารถ ในการเรียนของนักเรียนเป็นลำคัญ

๒. การฝึกออกเลี้ยงในชั่วโมงหนึ่ง ๆ ควรใช้เวลาฝึกประมาณ ๑๐ — ๑๕ นาที่ ไม่ควรใช้เวลาฝึกตลอดชั่วโมง หรือ ฝึกเลี้ยงต่าง ๆ ที่ปรากฏในบทเรียนในคราวเดียวกัน ควรแบ่งเลี้ยงที่จะนำมาฝึกในชั่วโมงหนึ่งให้เหมาะแก่เวลา ไม่ควรสอนหรือทบทวน หลายเรื่องหลายอย่างในคราวเดียวกัน ซึ่งจะทำให้นักเรียนเกิดความสับสนและยุ่งยาก ในการเรียน

- ๓. ในการผีกแต่ละครั้ง ถ้าปรากฏว่านักเรียนยังไม่สามารถออกเสียงได้ดี เท่าที่ควร ครูก็อาจนำเสียงนั้นมาฝึกทบทวนใหม่ในครั้งต่อไป การใช้ระยะเวลานาน เพื่อฝึกให้นักเรียนออกเสียงที่เป็นปัญหานั้น ๆ ให้ได้ อาจทำให้นักเรียนเบื่อหนายและ ท้อแท้ใจ เพื่อขจัดปัญหานี้ ครูจึงควรกำหนดระยะเวลาที่ควรฝึกคราวหนึ่ง ๆ ดังกล่าว ข้างต้น แต่ก็ควรนำเลียงที่เป็นปัญหานั้นมาฝึกซ้ำบอย ๆ และทบทวนเป็นระยะ ๆ ไป จนนักเรียนสามารถออกเลียงได่ถูกต้อง
- ส. ในการผิก ครูควรออกเสียงเป็นด้วอย่างที่ถูกต้องให้นักเรียน ไม่จำเป็นต้อง
 ใช้เวลาอธิบายลักษณะหรือบระเภทของเลียงแต่อย่างใด

การสอนศัพท์

ในหนังสือนี้ ได้จัดทำตอนที่เกี่ยวกับศัพท์ (Vocabulary) ไว้ โดยนำศัพท์ ที่นักเรียนควรทราบมาแต่งประโยค เพื่อให้นักเรียนได้ทราบความหมายและสังเกต ลักษณะการใช้ศัพท์เหล่านั้นก่อนจะนำมาใช้ในการฝึกไวยากรณ์ หรือก่อนที่จะให้นักเรียน ได้พบเห็นศัพท์เหล่านั้นในข้อความที่นักเรียนจะฝึกอ่าน การนำศัพท์เหล่านั้นมาใช้ในการฝึกไวยากรณ์ก็ตาม หรือในข้อความที่ให้นักเรียนฝึกอ่านก็ตามจะช่วยให้นักเรียนจำศัพท์ นั้น ๆ ได้ โดยเฉพาะในความหมายที่ครูประสงค์จะให้นักเรียนทราบ ครูควรเตือน ให้นักเรียนระลึกเล่มอว่าความหมายของศัพท์บางคำนั้น ขึ้นกับข้อความที่คำนั้นไปปรากฏ อยู่

อนึ่ง ศัพท์ที่ปรากฏในหนังสือเล่มนี้มีทั้งศัพท์ใหม่และศัพท์บางคำที่นักเรียน เรียนแล้วจากหนังสือ The Oxford English Course for Thailand ซึ่งเห็น สมควรจะนำมาทบทวนในหนังสือเล่มนี้ ศัพท์เหล่านี้จึงไม่จำเป็นต้องสอนเหมือนกับศัพท์ใหม่ สำหรับศัพท์ใหม่ที่นักเรียนยังไม่เคยเรียนนั้น เมื่อนำมาสอนแต่ละคำ ครูควรให้นักเรียน ว่าตามให้ถูกต้องทุกครั้ง

ข้อสังเกตในการสอนศัพท์

- ๑. ครูควรใช้เวลาให้เหมาะสมในการสอนศัพท์แต่ละคำ ศัพท์ใดที่เป็นศัพท์ใหม่
 หรือเป็นศัพท์ที่นักเรียนจะใช้ประโยชน์ได้ในโอกาสต่าง ๆ อาจใช้เวลาสอนหรือฝึก
 ให้มากกว่าศัพท์ที่นักเรียนเคยพบเห็นมาแล้วหรือศัพท์ซึ่งนักเรียนจะใช้ได้แต่ในบางโอกาส
 อย่างใดก็ตาม หนังสือนี้ก็ได้ช่วยแบ่งภาระครูในเรื่องการสอนศัพท์ โดยนักเรียนอาจ
 ศึกษาได้จากตัวอย่างที่ให้ไว้
- การสอนในชั่วโมงหนึ่ง ๆ ก็เช่นเดียวกับการฝึกการออกเสียง ครูควรแบ่ง
 จำนวนคำศัพท์ที่จะสอนแต่พอสมควร (ถ้ามีคำศัพท์มากในบทเรียนนั้น ๆ) ไม่จำเบ็น

ต้องสอนคำศัพท์ทุกคำให้หมดภายในชั่วโมง อาจแบ่งเวลาสำหรับสอนศัพท์ครั้งหนึ่ง ๆ ประมาณ ๑๐ นาทิ ศัพท์ที่เหลืออย่ก็นำไปสอนในครั้งต่อไป อนึ่ง ถ้าข้อความที่จะอ่าน ในบทหนึ่งยาว และครูประสงค์จะแบ่งตอนให้นักเรียนอ่านก็อาจทำได้ ในกรณีเช่นนี้ ให้เลือกศ์พท์ที่ปรากฏในข้อความตอนนั้นมาสอนก่อนที่จะให้นักเรียนอ่าน

๓. ครูควรนำศัพท์ที่นักเรียนได้เรียนแล้ว มาผึกให้นักเรียนใช้เป็นการทบทวน เป็นครั้งคราว ทั้งในการฝึกปากเปล่าและการเพียน

การฝึกไวยากรณ์

การจัดทำบทฝึกไวยากรณ์ปากเปล่าดังที่ปรากฏในบทเรียนหนึ่ง ๆ นั้น จุด
ประสงค์ก็เพื่อให้นักเรียนสามารถพุดภาษาอังกฤษได้ถูกต้องตามหลักไวยากรณ์ ซึ่งย่อม
เป็นผลสืบเนื่องไปถึงการเขียนภาษาอังกฤษของนักเรียน โดยช่วยให้นักเรียนเขียนได้
ถูกต้องและรวดเร็วขึ้น กลวิธีฝึกที่แนะไว้ในหนังสือเล่มนี้ก็คือ ครูสอนแบบประโยค
(patterns) แล้วให้นักเรียนฝึกแบบประโยคนั้น ๆ โดยการนำคำหรือกลุ่มคำนั้นมา
แทนคำบางคำหรือกลุ่มคำบางกลุ่มในแบบประโยคนั้น จนนักเรียนสามารถจะใช้แบบ
ประโยคดังกล่าวได้คล่องแคล่วพอสมควร

ในบทนี้กไวยากรณ์แต่ละบทนั้น ได้จัดทำข้อ ๑ — ๓ หรือ ๔ ไว้เป็นตัวอย่าง สำหรับการนึก (ในตัวอย่างที่ให้ ได้ใส่เส้นแสดงการออกเสียงที่ถูกต้องไว้ด้วย) ครู ควรแสดงวิธีที่จะนึกให้นักเรียนดูเป็นตัวอย่างและอธิบายสั้น ๆ เพื่อให้นักเรียนทราบว่า จะนี้กอะไร และ จะนึกอย่างไร และในขณะนึกครูจะต้องแน่ใจว่านักเรียนนึก ด้วยความเข้าใจ อนึ่ง ครูไม่ควรบอกคำตอบนักเรียน นอกจากนักเรียนติดขัด หรือพูด ไม่ถูกต้อง และเมื่อบอกคำตอบให้ ครูต้องให้นักเรียนพูดประโยคที่ถูกซ้ำทุกครั้ง

สำหรับบทฝึกไวยากรณ์บางบทนั้น นักเรียนจะต้องนำคำที่ให้ไปใส่ในประโยค ให้ถูกที่ แต่ถ้าการนำคำไปบรรจุในประโยคมีเพียงแห่งเดียว การฝึกก็จะกลายเป็นแบบ เครื่องจักร กล่าวคือนักเรียนให้คำตอบได้โดยไม่ต้องใช้ความรู้หรือความคิดเลย ฉะนั้น เพื่อมิให้เกิดมีปัญหาดังกล่าว จึงได้แทรกบทฝึกซึ่งนักเรียนจะต้องนำคำที่ครูให้ไปใส่ใน ที่ต่าง ๆ กันในประโยค ดังตัวอย่างบทฝึกต่อไปนี้

จากตัวอย่างข้างบนจะเห็นได้ว่าในการนึกนั้นนักเรียนจะต้องนำคำที่ครูให้ไปใส่ ให้ถูกที่ในประโยค ถ้าใส่ผิดที่ประโยคนั้นจะไม่มีความหมาย และนอกจากใส่คำให้ถูก ที่แล้ว การปรับเปลี่ยนรูปคำกริยาให้ถูกต้องก็เป็นเรื่องสำคัญเช่นเดียวกัน หลักสำคัญ ในการนึกไวยากรณ์ปากเปล่าก็คือ ครูจะต้องนึกนักเรียนจนนักเรียนสามารถให้คำตอบ ที่ครูต้องการได้ถูกต้อง

ในการจัดทำบทเรียนแค่ละบทในหนังสือเล่มนี้ ได้เพ่งเล็งในเรื่องการฝึกไวยากรณ์ เป็นสำคัญ ฉะนั้นประมาณ ครึ่ง หนึ่งหรือ ๕๐% ของเนื้อหาในบทเรียนหนึ่ง ๆ จึงเป็น เรื่องของการฝึกไวยากรณ์

ข้อสังเกตในการผึ้กไวยากรณ์

- ๑. ในตอนที่เกี่ยวกับการนี้กไวยากรณ์ (Oral Grammar Drills) ได้แสดง หัวข้อไวยากรณ์ที่นักเรียนจะต้องนี้ก พร้อมด้วยตัวอย่างไว้ ฉะนั้นก่อนจะนำบทนี้ก ไวยากรณ์แต่ละบทมานี้กครูจะต้องให้นักเรียนเข้าใจสิ่งที่นักเรียนจะนี้ก จึงจะช่วยให้ การนี้กมีความหมาย และเป็นประโยชน์แก่นักเรียน
- ๒. ในการเรียนชั่วโมงหนึ่ง ๆ ครูควรเพ่งเล็งให้นักเรียนฝึกไวยากรณ์ให้มาก จะเป็นการฝึกเนื้อหาใหม่ หรือทบทวนสิ่งที่สอนไปแล้วก็ตาม ควรใช้เวลาอย่างน้อย
 ๒๐ ๓๐ นาทีในชั่วโมงหนึ่ง โดยนำบทฝึกไวยากรณ์มาฝึกประมาณ ๑— ๒ บท ในคราวหนึ่ง ๆ เท่าที่จะเห็นสมควร อนึ่งในชณะฝึกปากเปล่านั้น อาจให้นักเรียนได้เชียน สลับไปบ้างเป็นการเปลี่ยนอิริยาบถ เช่น ให้นักเรียนออกมาเชียนกระดานดำประโยค

ที่ตนพูด หรือที่นักเรียนคนอื่นพูด เป็นต้น และเมื่อการฝึกปากเปล่าได้ผลเป็นที่พอใจแล้ว ก็ควรให้นักเรียนได้เขียนบทฝึกนั้น ๆ ด้วย (ได้แนะนำบทฝึกที่ควรให้นักเรียนเขียนไว้ ในตอนที่เกี่ยวกับการเขียนแล้ว)

๓. ครูจะต้องทบทวนสิ่งที่ได้ฝึกนักเรียนไปแล้วเป็นครั้งคราว อาจให้นักเรียน ทำแบบฝึกหัดไวยากรณ์ เพิ่มเติมซึ่งครูอาจคัดเลือกมาจากที่อื่น หรือจัดทำขึ้นตามที่ เห็นเหมาะสม และถ้านักเรียนยังติดขัดไม่คล่อง ก็อาจจะต้องสอนใหม่ การทบทวนโดย สม่ำเสมอย่อมจะช่วยให้นักเรียนเข้าใจและจดจำได้แม่นยำ

การฝึกอ่าน

บทความที่เตรียมไว้ในตอนที่เกี่ยวกับการอ่าน (Reading) ก็เพื่อให้นักเรียน ได้ฝึกทั้งในการอ่านออกเสียงและการอ่านในใจ เพื่อช่วยนักเรียนในเรื่องการออกเสียง ได้ชืดเล้นแสดงการเน้นหนักไว้ช้างใต้คำหรือพยางค์ เป็น ๒ แบบ

- ก. ซีดเล้นดำหนักแสดงการเน้นหนักที่สุดในประโยค (primary stress) ดังนั้นในการอ่านจึงต้องออกเสียงเน้นหนักที่คำหรือพยางค์นั้น ๆ
- ข. จุดข้างใต้ แสดงการเน้นหนักรองลงมา (secondary stress) ในการอ่าน ไม่ต้องออกเลียงเน้นหนักเท่าประเภทแรก แต่จะต้องเน้นเลียงหนักกว่าค่าหรือพยางค์ ที่ไม่มีเครื่องหมายเลย

การออกเลี้ยงเน้นหนักประเภทที่สอง อาจผิดเพี้ยนกันไปบ้างในหมูขนที่พูดภาษา
อังกฤษ แต่ก็ไม่ถือว่าสำคัญเท่าประเภทแรก ในการฝึก ครูควรอ่านให้นักเรียนพัง
เป็นตัวอย่าง พยายามออกเสียงและสำเนียงให้เป็นไปอย่างธรรมชาติ แล้วให้นักเรียน
อ่านตามทีหลัง หรือจะให้นักเรียนอ่านข้อความนั้นโดยให้สังเกตพยางค์หรือคำที่มี
เครื่องหมายแสดงการเน้นหนักดังกล่าวข้างต้นก็ได้

สำหรับการฝึกอ่านในใจนั้น โดยเหตุที่ศัพท์และไวยากรณ์ปรากฏในบทความ ส่วนเป็นสิ่งที่นักเรียนเรียนและฝึกแล้ว (ในตอนที่เกี่ยวกับศัพท์ และไวยากรณ์) จึง ไม่ค่อยมีปัญหามากนัก เมื่อให้นักเรียนอ่านควรกำหนดเวลาให้อ่าน โดยคำนึงการฝึก ให้นักเรียนสามารถอ่านเข้าใจได้รวดเร็วเป็นสำคัญ และหลังจากนักเรียนอ่านในใจจบแล้ว ครูถามคำถามเพื่อทดสอบความเข้าใจของนักเรียน ครูอาจถามคำถามเพิ่มเติมจาก คำถามที่เตรียมไว้ในท้ายข้อความที่อ่านแล้วก็ได้

การฝึกเขียน

ในตอนที่เกี่ยวกับการเขียน (writing) ได้จัดทำแบบฝึกหัดที่ควรให้นักเรียน เขียนไว้ พร้อมทั้งแนะนำวิธีทำ แบบฝึกหัดเขียนนี้โดยเฉพาะบทฝึกไวยากรณ์ได้ทำ หลังจากที่ฝึกปากเปล่าจนนักเรียนคล่องแล้ว ไม่ควรรอจนกว่าฝึกตอนต่าง ๆ ในบทเรียน เสร็จ จึงจะให้นักเรียนเขียนในตอนท้ายของบทเรียน และเนื่องจากการเขียนค่อนข้างจะ กินเวลา ครูจึงอาจแบ่งงานให้ไปทำเป็นการบ้านบ้างเท่าที่เห็นสมควร

อนึ่ง ครูควรเพ่งเล็งในการฝึกให้นักเรียนได้เขียนให้มาก อย่างน้อยที่สุดนักเรียน ควรจะได้ทำแบบฝึกหัดต่าง ๆ ที่กำหนดไว้ในบทเรียนแต่ละบท และถ้าสามารถทำได้ ก็อาจให้นักเรียนได้ทำแบบฝึกหัดไวยากรณ์ที่สอดคล้องกับสิ่งที่นักเรียนเรียนเป็นการ เพิ่มเติม หรือการฝึกเขียนอื่น ๆ ที่เห็นสมควร และเหมาะสมกับพื้นความรู้ของนักเรียน ในชั้น สิ่งที่ควรระลึกถึงก็คือ เมื่อจะให้นักเรียนเขียนแบบฝึกหัดใด ๆ ก็ตาม ควรแน่ใจ ว่าสิ่งที่นักเรียนเขียนแบบฝึกหัดใด ๆ ก็ตาม ควรแน่ใจ ว่าสิ่งที่นักเรียนเขียนแบบสึกหัดใด "ก็ตาม ควรแน่ใจ
