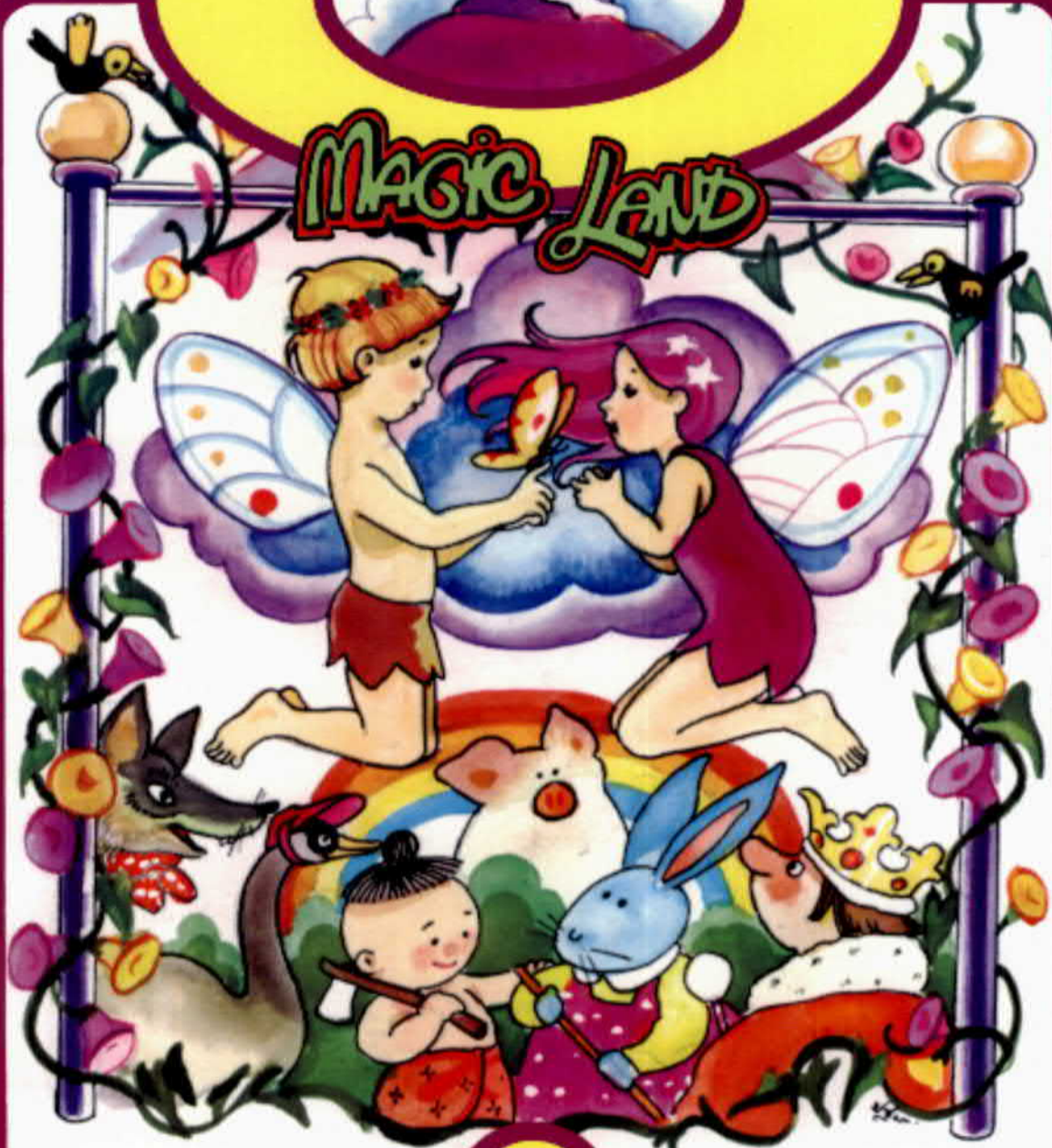

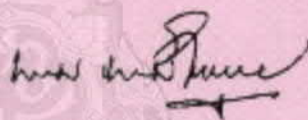

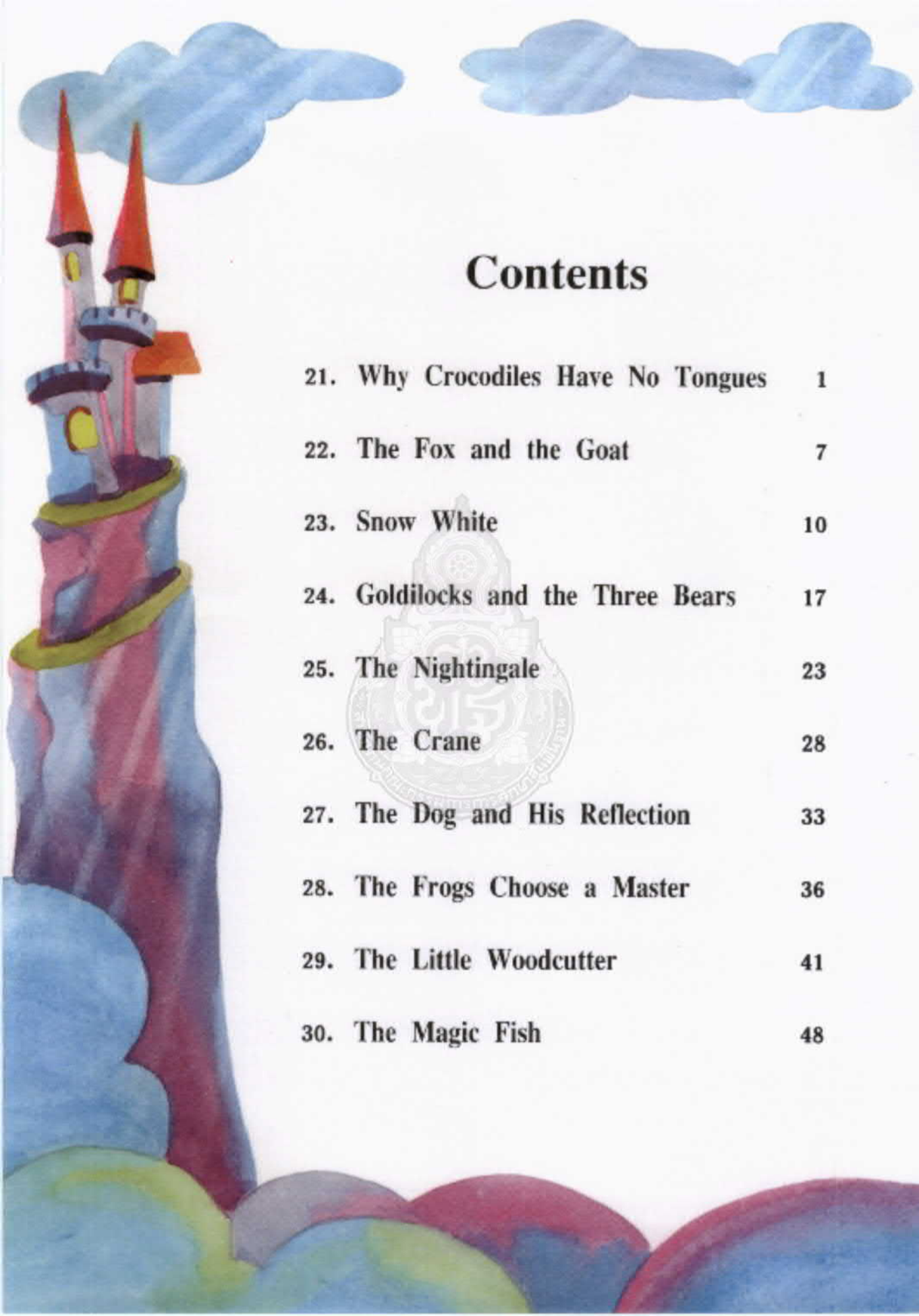

So he said,

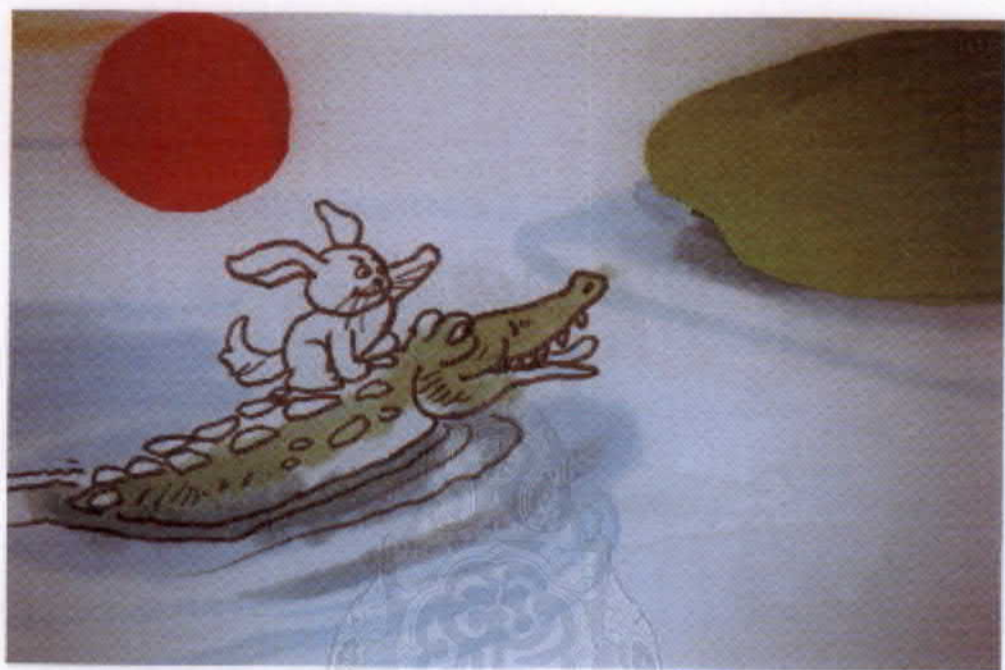


"Crocodile, let's be friends.

"That's great. Thanks."



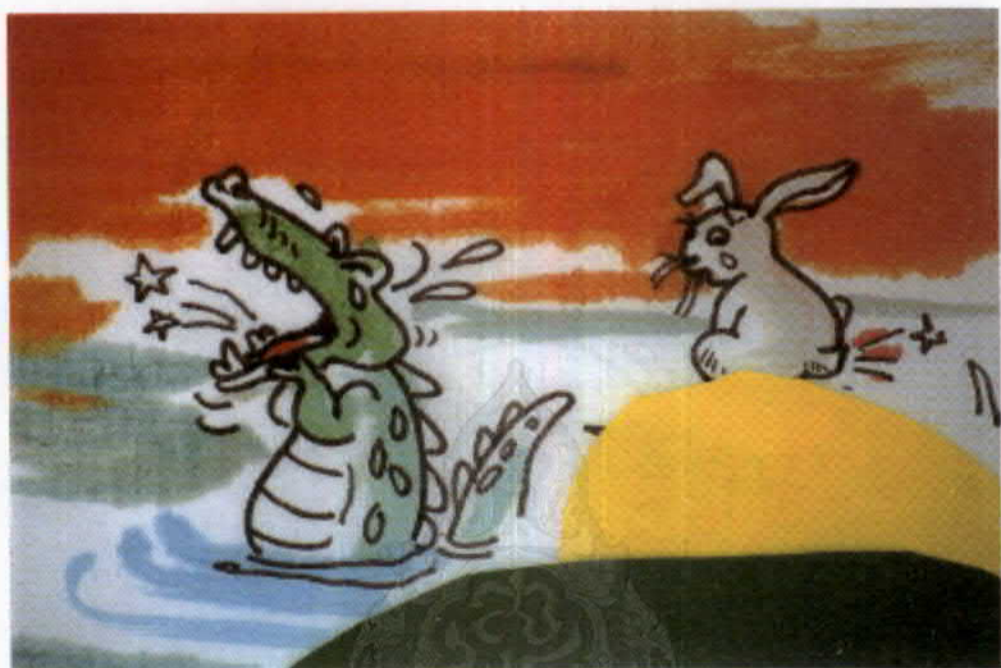
Once they got to the other side,

"Well, Fox. Is the water good?"

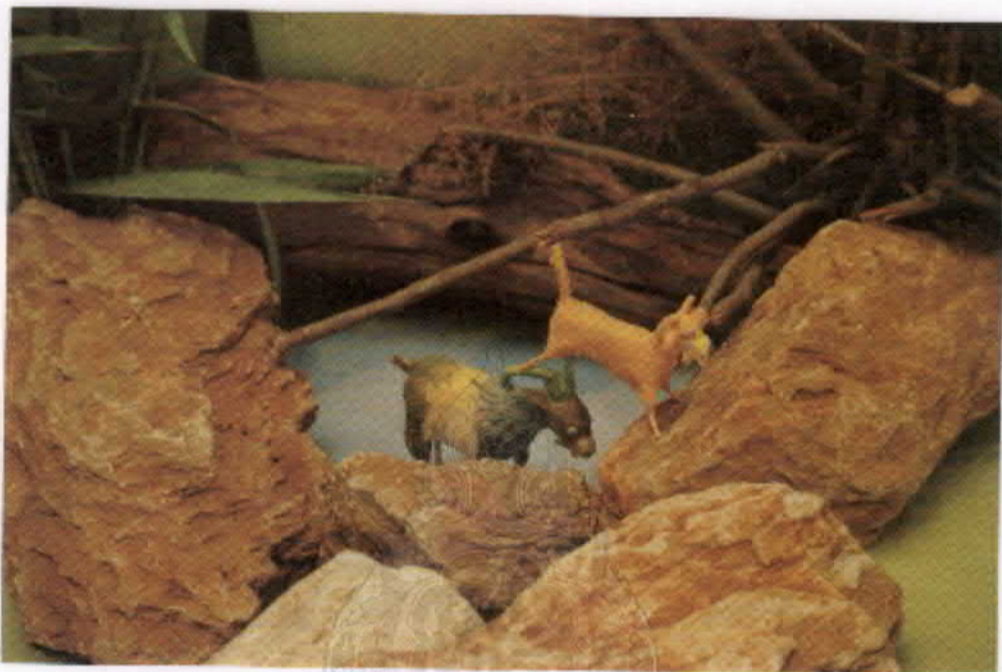
The fox saw his chance.

So she ate it all up.



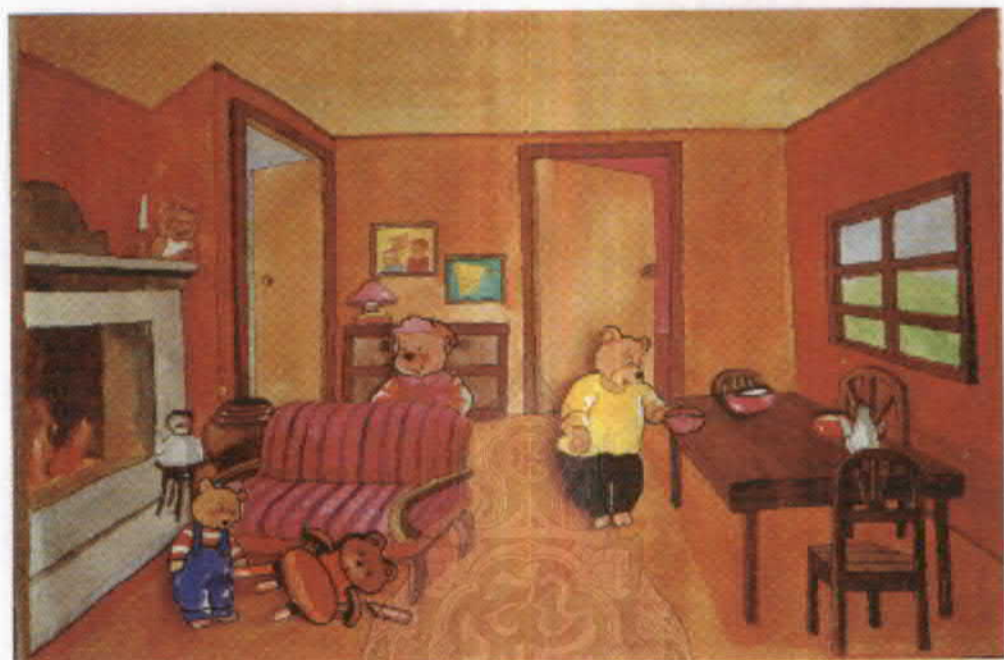
Then she went into the living room.

and saw their bowls.

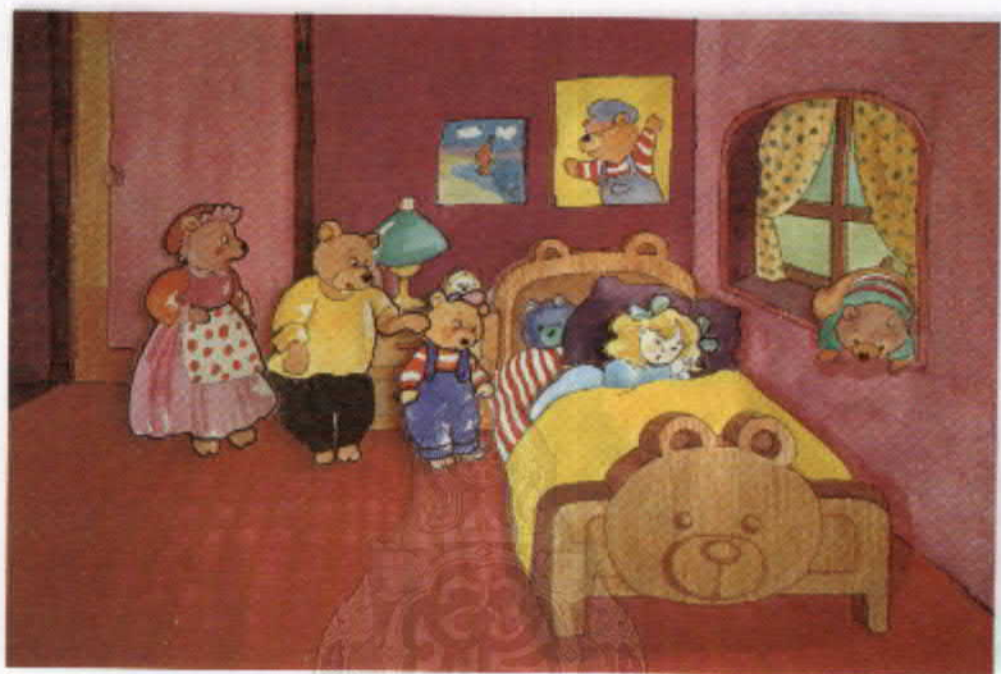


"Someone ate my food,"

Your Majesty."

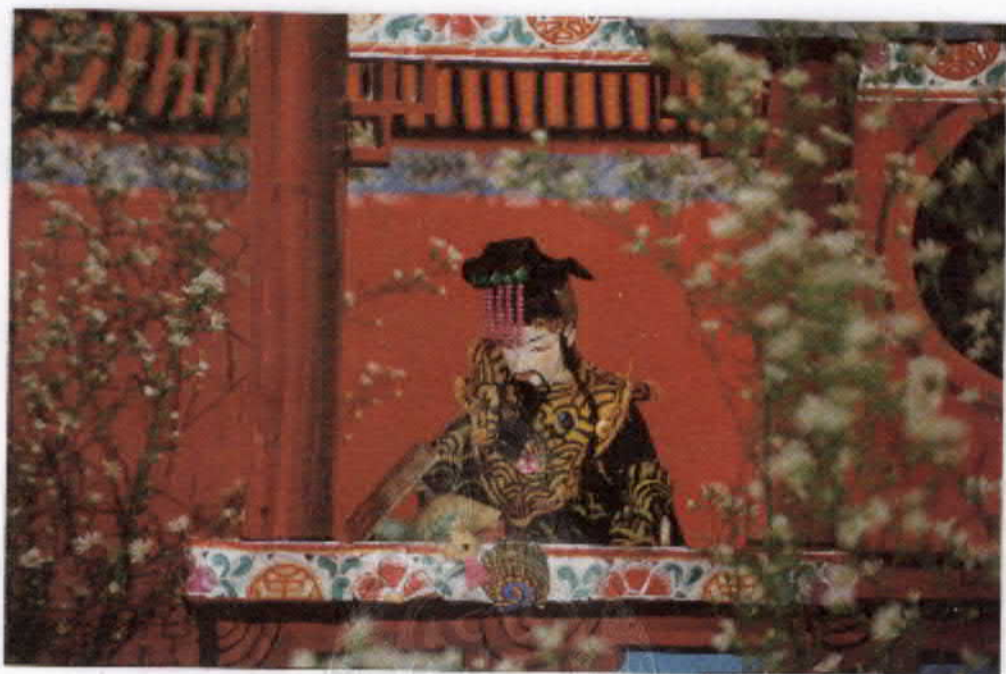
The king was very happy.

The crane turned back into the girl.



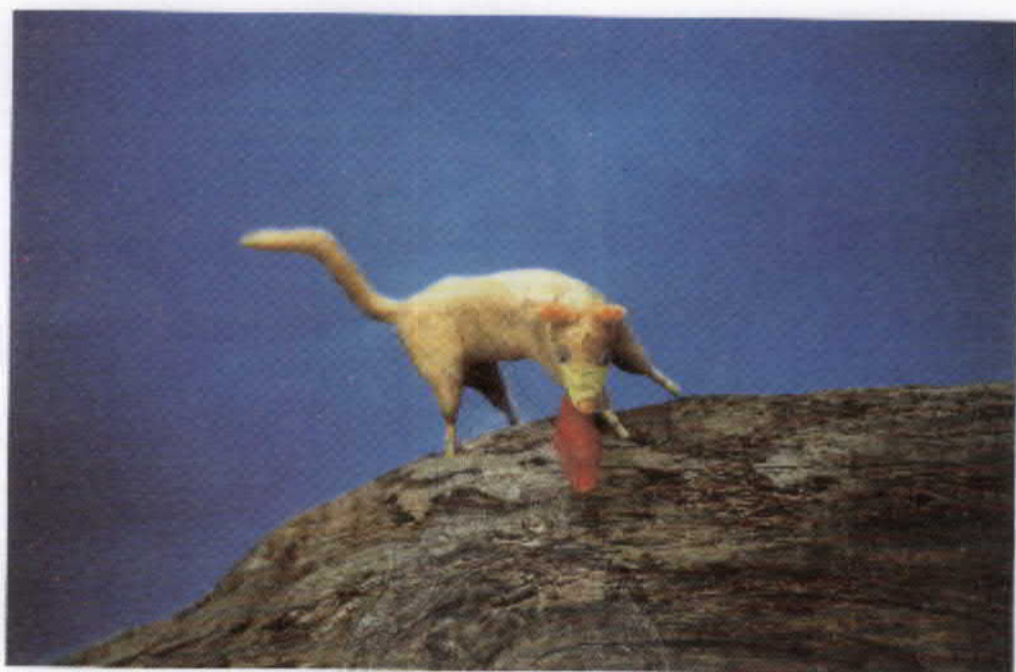
"I'm the crane that you helped.
