



Three Billy Goats Gruff




Once upon a time there were three billy goats,

"Clip, clop, clip, clop."


The ugly troll said, "Who's walking on my bridge?

Big Brother Goat started to walk across the bridge.


"Clip, clop, clip, clop."

So the mother crab tried to walk forward, but she walked sideways instead.


She tried to walk sideways, but she walked forward.

"It was me.


Please do not cat me.

The little mouse heard him and quickly came to the rescue.




Crocodile and the Monkey

The Turtle and the Two Swans




Once upon a time there was a turtle who lived near a river.

he thought.




One day two swans came to rest on a rock beside him.

The two swans thought that it was impossible, but the turtle insisted.


So the two swans took him to a great height in the sky by holding each end of a stick.

"Oh, no.


I have to go to Grandmother's house," said Red Riding Hood.

Red Riding Hood came and said,




"Grandmother, I brought you some cakes."

"The sky is falling!


The sky is falling!"

"The sky is falling!


The sky is falling!"

The little pigs said, "Not by the hair on our chinny chin chins."


So the wolf huffed and puffed and he blew the stick house down.

The little pigs said, "Not by the hair on our chinny chin chins."




So the big bad wolf huffed and puffed and puffed and puffed and huffed and puffed until he tired himself out.
